Notice is hereby given that **Crystal Rig IV Limited, SC167068** whose registered address is **c/o Harper Macleod LLP, The Cadoro, 45 Gordon Street, Glasgow, G1 3PE** has applied to the Scottish Ministers for consent under Section 36 of the Electricity Act 1989 to construct and operate a **Wind Farm** located on the East Lammermuir Plateau of the Lammermuir Hills in Scottish Borders and East Lothian (Central Grid Reference 367100, 667900). The installed capacity of the proposed generating station would be up to **48 MW** comprising **4 turbines** with a ground to blade tip height of **up to 149.9 metres**, **3 turbines** with a ground to blade tip height of **up to 174.5 metres** and **4 turbines** with a ground to blade tip height of **up to 200 metres**. The proposed development is subject to Environmental Impact Assessment and an **Environmental Impact Assessment Report (EIAR)** has been produced.

Crystal Rig IV Limited has also applied for a direction under Section 57(2) of the Town and Country Planning (Scotland) Act 1997 that planning permission for the proposed development be deemed to be granted.

Any subsequent additional information which is submitted by the applicant will be subject to further public notice in this manner, and representations to such information will be accepted as per this notice.

As a result of a statutory objection from the relevant planning authority, or where Scottish Ministers decide to exercise their discretion to do so, Scottish Ministers can also cause a Public Local Inquiry (PLI) to be held.

Following examination of the environmental information, Scottish Ministers will determine the application for consent in two ways:

-) Consent the proposal, with or without conditions attached; or
-) Reject the proposal.
